


A surprise attack at dawn on June 9, 1863, on J.E.B. Stuart's cavalry at Brandy Station, Virginia, resulted in the

largest cavalry engagement in the American Civil War. Join us on a riveting tactical study of the battle on May 4-5, 2019 led by Clark Bud Hall. Hall was a leading advocate in saving the battlefield. We'll follow the course of the battle over a wide-ranging area and assess the battle's enormous strategic implications not only for Gettysburg, but for the remainder of the war.


To Care for Those Who Have Borne the Battle

Accompanied by founding BGES member Vinny DiMattina (BGES member #10, since 1994), the group did a whirlwind summary of this important campaign, noteworthy for the mortal wounding of Stonewall Jackson. The day-

long tour was the first of 10 in 2019.

The tours continue to achieve their primary purpose of providing mentorship and therapeutic outing that helps transition warriors back into American mainstream life.
